

## PGI Data License Agreement

1. The data from the ground stations operated by the Polar Geophysical Institute (PGI) are the intellectual property of PGI.
2. PGI grants to the user (the licensee) a non-exclusive license to retrieve and use data sets and other products from the PGI Data Service in accordance with this license.
3. PGI data can be obtained directly (if available) or on special request. The request should be addressed to the Primary Investigator (PI) of the specific data set. The data must not be passed on to others or must not be included in a distributed data base without direct agreement from PGI. When the data shall be redistributed, the licensee has to ensure the acceptance of the license agreement by third parties.
4. Retrieval, electronic download, and use of data sets is free of charge for academic research purposes, unless otherwise stipulated. The use or reproduction of the data for other, including commercial, purposes requires a prior written permission from PGI, and is generally not free of charge.
5. Regardless of whether the data are quality controlled or not, PGI does not accept any liability for the accuracy and/or correct interpretation of the data. Data interpretation must follow scientific rules and is always a user's responsibility. Correct data interpretation is solely the responsibility of data users.
6. Anyone may freely reproduce the quicklooks obtained on the site of PGI. However, the quicklooks are not intended for scientific analysis and should not be used for those purposes without consent of the corresponding PI. If they are reproduced by any means, the users should acknowledge PGI as the data source.
7. If new products including any results of data processing are derived from PGI data sets, and/or if PGI data are used for scientific analysis and are to be published or presented by any means, PGI requires discussion of co-authorship with the PI of the data set. In case the co-authorship is declined, the users should acknowledge PGI as the data source in all publications, presentations and reports. Here comes recommended wording:  
*We acknowledge the Polar Geophysical Institute and [PI name] for the use of [type of data].*
8. Copies of final reports and publications must be sent to the PI so that the bibliography of the use of PGI data could be updated.
9. The information on PGI site is in the public domain, unless specifically annotated otherwise, and may be used freely by the public. Before using the information obtained from this site, special attention should be given to the date and time when the data and products displayed were retrieved. The content of this information must not be modified before being presented officially . Users are requested to inform PGI of any problems connected with the data or the data provision. Such feedback will increase availability and quality of the data.
